Evansburg Lions Club Highlights from 2015

The members of the Evansburg Lions Club would like to share some of the activities and services we performed in the community during 2015. Cash donations were made to the following: Camp He Ho Ha, Brightwood Youth Ranch, Western Blind Golf Association, Hope Resource Centre (Woman's Shelter), Lions Foundation of Canada (Dog Guides), Santa's Anonymous, Pembina Valley Days, and (CT4DV) towards a CT Scanner for Drayton Valley Hospital. We had also raised over \$3000 towards the Community sign which has recently been installed.

We sponsored two plaques for the 4-H Public Speaking Contest as we have done for several years as well as Plaques for two Student of the Year Awards – one for a grade 12 student and one for a Grade 9 student.

We also offer a yearly scholarship to a graduate from the community who is going on to post secondary education. The Lions Legacy Scholarship of \$500 was started several years ago to commemorate 75 Years of Lionism in Alberta and has been offered every year since by the two local Lions Clubs - Evansburg Lions sponsor the one for a student from Yellowhead County and the Entwistle Lions sponsor one for a student from Parkland County who is graduating from Grand Trunk High School or who is a local homeschool graduate who meets the criteria required. The Lions of Alberta Foundation also provides a matching Scholarship in the amount of \$500 to the winner.

This years winner was Hayley Dudla from Wildwood.

You may ask where the funds come from to do all this – the answer is that we cut grass at the Evansburg Cemetery two or three times over the summer. We also do a yearly Cash Raffle (formerly known as the Duck Race) which was started many years ago. The past two years we have also done a Chicken Drop Raffle 50/50 in conjunction with PV Daze, this year we also did one at the Entwistle Canada Day Celebration. We had a float in both Parades this year and had several volunteers helping at the Entwistle Rodeo.

The other project that we have taken on is assisting with the BEE Aware Program for grade 7 students and

the "It's Cool to Know your Way in a Relationship" Program for grade 8 students.

Other volunteer work is done by assisting with PV Daze celebrations, co-sponsoring the Community Children's Christmas Party on the second Sunday in Dec each year.

We also had some help from a few people in the community with the grass cutting so we invited the young people who helped to attend our Christmas Potluck Supper and presented them with a Certificate of Appreciation for their time .

At present we have 16 members and are always looking for new members and new ideas. We meet the second Tuesday of each month at 8:00 PM.

Morinville Lions Club is going to sell Vesey's Bulbs from now till 01 May. The fundraiser is part of their contribution to support the 3061 (1 CER) Morinville Royal Canadian Army Cadet Corp to send some of the cadets to France in April 2017 to attend the 100th Anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge commemorative ceremonies. The 11 day trip would take them through Rome, Vimy Region and Paris. They would also have an opportunity take in the history of Rome before visiting Ortona, the site of the bloodiest battle in the Canadian WW2 Italian Campaign and honor the Canadian War heroes buried at the casino War Cemetery.

Lion member Deborah Robillard, Chairperson heading the fundraiser said, "This is a life changing experience as 20,000 Canadian youth will march to Vimy Ridge, France to participate in the 100th Anniversary Ceremonies. All close to the same age as these cadets. They will learn the sacrifices those young soldiers made for the freedom we have today."

29th Annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest

A Celebration of Peace



Sponsor a Lions International Peace Poster Contest and join clubs worldwide in sharing children's visions of peace with your community.

How the Contest Works

Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2016. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "A Celebration of Peace."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of theme.

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

Awards

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows:

- **International Grand Prize Winner** receives a trip to an award ceremony where he/she will receive a cash award of US\$5,000 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony.
- **23 Merit Award Winners** each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.

How to Enter

Lions clubs must order a Peace Poster Contest kit from the Club Supplies Sales Department at International Headquarters. Available in all 11 official languages, it costs US\$11.95, plus shipping, handling and applicable taxes. Each kit contains everything your club needs to sponsor one* school or organized, sponsored youth group:

- **Official Club Contest Guide & Rules**
- **Official School or Youth Group Contest Guide & Rules**
- **Participant Flyer** may be duplicated and given to each participating student to take home
- **Sticker** to place on back of winning poster
- **Certificates** for contest winner and school or youth group

**Clubs can sponsor more than one contest in either the same or multiple school(s) and/or youth group(s) by purchasing more than one kit. Clubs will send one poster per each contest sponsored to the next level of judging.*

The Lions International Essay Contest entry form is also included in this kit and on the LCI website.

Kits are available January 15 – October 1, 2016.

Purchase your kit early to allow adequate time for shipment and contest planning.

Newsletter Notes

Our apologies to those of you who submitted pictures, but which did not appear in this newsletter. Editorial and file size constraints made it impractical to include them. No fewer than 8 pictures of Lions presenting donation cheques were submitted.

I like pictures, but please, when submitting, note that we prefer pictures of Lions and the people they serve doing things. Feel free to send pictures of your tail twister being hung by the heels, your President flipping pancakes, kids playing in their new playground, campers in a Lions campground sitting around a fire - use your imagination.

About those pictures - many of the ones I get from you turn out fuzzy - the problem is usually not focus - it is camera movement. Our meeting places are generally poorly lit, so while the exposure may be good, the camera or cell phone uses a **very** slow shutter speed. Getting more light can be a problem, but holding the camera steady helps a lot - try holding it against a solid surface, or steady your body against a wall or post.

Also, the built-in flashes are effective only at very short

distances - for a digital camera, it is usually not more than 10 feet or so - and the ones in digital cameras are worse!

Please - do not "email" your pictures. Most programs allow you to "email" pictures, but they automatically reduce the file size to make them easier to transmit, and while they look goodish on a computer screen, they print very poorly. If you want to send a picture, it should be a minimum of 400k. If you know how to reduce a picture's file size, great! If you don't, just send the original as an attachment.

Finally, the most interesting material in a newsletter is news about what is happening around the District. Let us know what you are doing - be proud of your service!

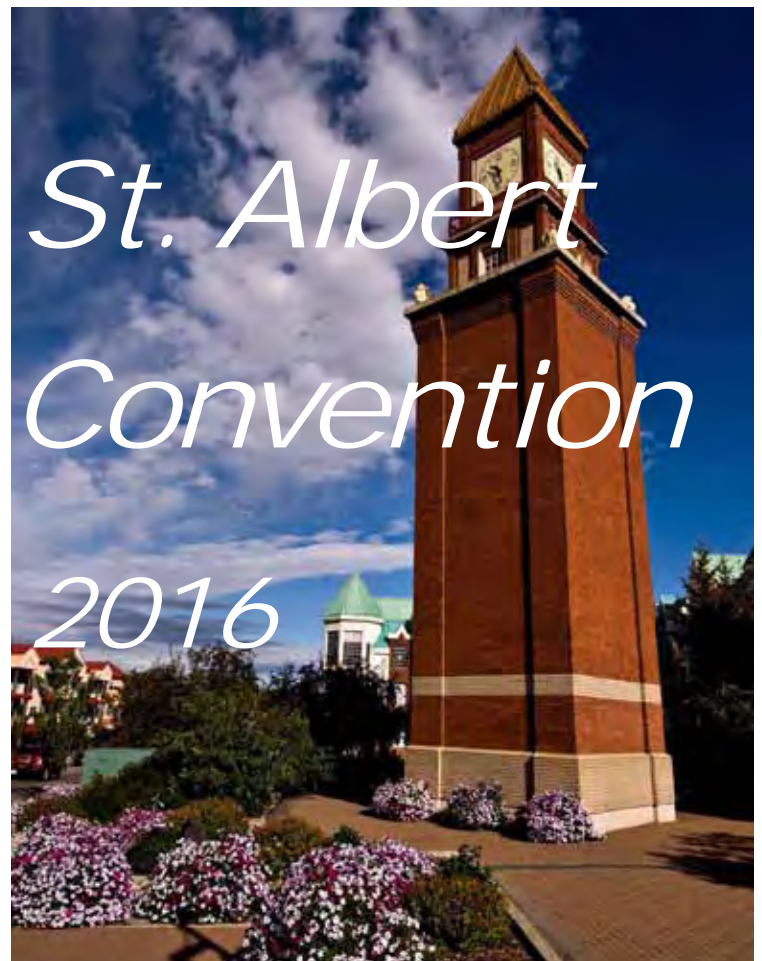
