
It is encouraging that some of the remaining members will join the

Lions Project Pride

Lions Project Pride is a program for Canadian Lions Clubs. If your Lions Club chooses to participate, you will express to your community the pride your club has in Canada and in being a Lion.

Across the country, Lions Clubs have the opportunity

to express their own pride in their community and country, as well as instill a level of pride in the country's young people. Lions Clubs who wish to participate in this program contact local school officials requesting permission to visit schools or visit with classroom teachers to present a Canadian flag (15.5cm χ 25.5cm; 6" χ 10") and a Project Pride certificate to Grade 1 students. The certificate, in English or French, describes the diversity of our country and the pride we have in being Canadian.

Lions Clubs from British Columbia to Newfoundland are participating in this project and are sharing their community and national pride with over 40,000 students each year.

Involve Your Club!

- Contact your school superintendent or principal, requesting permission for a member of your club to visit each Grade 1 class to present a Canadian flag and certificate to each student. (The month of June is preferred)
- Determine the total number of flags and certificates that you will require.
- Complete and return the order form (attached) with cheque payment.
- Receive your flags and certificates and share your Lions Pride!

Prepare for Your Visit

What will you tell the students when you visit? Here are some ideas;

- Who you are
- Your Lions Club Name
- What Lions do (Leo programs, youth activities, etc.)
- Purpose of your visit
- The importance of Canada Day
- The Maple Leaf emblem (Try sharing the story of our flag)
- Discuss the flag

Things to Remember

- Make constructive comments
- Encourage discussion
- Present flags
- Ask the teacher to print the student's names on the certificates
- Read Certificates
- Remember a flag for the teacher!
