District Governor Bob Hunter and Vice District Governor Hank Hoekstra, with Edmonton Goldengate Lions President Brett Symington at the opening of an "end of Life" room at the Cross Cancer Hospital. This room is outfitted to be less institutional than a regular patient room, and has amenities, such as a TV, microwave, sink, small fridge, easy chairs, bathroom, and a sofa-bed, so that families can be together.

Golden Gate Lions have worked with the Cross for 30 years, as their

signature project, donating over \$350,000 over that time to create comfortable lounges, patient rooms, and service areas. As well, the club has donated four vans to ferry patients and their families to and from their temporary accommodations - such as Ronald MacDonald House - while in Edmonton for treatment. Current fundraising is aimed at buying the fifth van for this purpose.




#### **Lions Colouring Books**

#### **District C-1 Notes**

The District L and District I newsletters are getting thinner, as the Districts wind down their operations in expectation of the merge into District C-1 on July 1. So, to help move things along, the following may prove useful to you.

# District Officer Training Schools and World Wide Induction Day

As District C-1 does not exist yet, we cannot organize schools as District C-1 (No budget), so the following three options are available: There will be one for all Lions in both Districts I and L, on Saturday, April 18, at the Sands Hotel, 12340 Fort Rd Edmonton. #### Zones

I have reduced the zones in the new District C-1 to 9, from the current 27 zones in Districts I and L combined. This is an initial allocation only, and may be adjusted to best suit everyone's needs. I am encouraging zone chairs to consider how they would like to organize their zones, including subdividing the zones, each with a zone chair, which may elevate (or demote, depending on how you feel about it...) a zone chair to a Region chair. This model has not been used for some time in our area, but it may ease the burden on all concerned.

#### **Our First Convention**

#### First Cabinet Meeting

is tentatively scheduled for Devon Lions' Campgroun, on August 15, and in keeping with District I's practiseof making the first Cabinet meeting part of a weekend campout. Devon Lions will host a barbecue, and there will be some camping spaces available. Note, however, that the campground is a popular place, so as soon as details are finalized, we will circulate the information, and urge early reservations.

#### **District Directories**

These will no longer be printed, but distributed as PDF files. The print versions are expensive, and have long suffered from slow distribution. Electronic distribution will also make it easier to make changes and corrections during the year.

PU-101s (Club Officer Reporting) This reporting can also be done online, but needs to be completed as soon as Clubs hold elections are held. Directories, and our ability to communicate with each other hinge on this. Report whether you are changing club officers or not. All too often information (especially emill addresses) get out of date. Also, please ensure that your club's meeting dates and times are accurate - this will make the planning of visits, by other clubs, and District resource people, easier to plan.
