A Memorial Service was held for Morinville Lions Club member Harvey Atkinson on the 23 April at the Morinville Legion. Harvey Atkinson passed away 19 December 2015 in Victoria BC with Eva, his loving wife of 67 years by his side.

Harvey joined the Morinville Lions Club in 1971 and was a very active member being President 1966-67, 1985-86, 1997-98. He held a record of 36 years 100% attendance. Harvey was also District Governor 37 B 1994-1995, Zone Chairman 37 B several times.

Harvey received numerous Lions awards, which included twice a Melvin Jones fellow and ring 2009, Jack Dobush Fellowship, President's Appreciation Awards along with many more awards.



Harvey was also the Morinville Citizen of the Year in 1967 and 1977.

These are some of his achievements, Lions Beef roundup, Lions Figure Skating, Project Pride bringing awareness to Grade1 students about the Canadian Flag, sat on Board of Directors for Heritage Placed 6 plex units and Lions Manor, Halloween Patrols, Frontier Daze Float Parade, Splash Water Park and more.


Harvey's passion to be known or heard put him on Morinville Town Council in 1978.

Lions Quest: Oh my! I am shocked and so incredibly pleased! That is not an amount I was expecting! How absolutely wonderful! My club also donated \$4500, so I now have \$9500 as of today. Wow! maybe we can actually get something going again!!! I am speaking at the Zone Meeting in Vegreville on April 30th, so hopefully, will get more donations from the clubs in that area.

I did get some bad news about Frog Lake. I was all ready to leave early morning on April 13 when I got an email from the principal saying our noon meeting was cancelled. So I phoned her, and she said there had been a murder overnight, and everyone was traumatized and she had to deal with that. She sounded so sad, and she also said, "can I just say no

and be done with this?" My heart just broke for her, as I know this program would prevent exactly these kinds of incidents from happening if people had better coping and communication skills. It shook me up for two days, and I can't imagine the terrible time everyone is dealing with in Frog Lake. For now, I have to respect what she wants.

However, I did talk to the principal at Ashmont School where there are about 600 kids in a very rural setting, and he was so receptive to the idea that I am traveling to Ashmont on May 3 to meet with the teachers and hope to convince them of the virtues of the training. Ashmont School covers a huge area, including some First Nations students as well. If they want the training, I will try to encourage teachers from Frog Lake to sit in, too.

I also have a meeting tomorrow (April 20), with a principal here in Edmonton at a high needs school, and hope to get positive feedback there. They do subscribe to the "The Leader In Me" program, so it might be hard to convince them but I will give it my best.

I met with Lori Perley again on Friday morning last week as she was in town, and she is so encouraging and has been a great support. She just knows it all, upside down and backwards, and knows the struggle to convince teachers even though LQ is already approved as a resource in the Alberta Education Health curriculum.

We will have an LQ booth set up at convention in St. Albert.
