Southern Alberta Flood **Fundraiser**

In June this year, Lions in Edmonton surrounding area watched in horror as swollen rivers and creeks caused devastation to many communities in the southern part of +: our province. This flooding was the worst in the province's history with $\frac{1}{6}$ states of local emergency issued to over 25 communities. Sixty-five thousand residents in Calgary were " told to leave their homes. The hardest hit community was the Town of High E River where all its 13,000 residents were evacuated. Thousands homes and millions of dollars of $\stackrel{\circ}{=}$ infrastructure were destroyed by the $\frac{\omega}{2}$ historic floods. Sensing the urgent need to help, the Edmonton Chinese 5 Lions Club quickly established a committee to organize a dinner to raise funds to help those who have been affected by the floods. Within E days the committee was able to Devon, Edmonton Host, Edmonton solicit over 65 silent auction items from individuals and local businesses and enlist the free services of entertainers. The Dynasty Century 5 Palace restaurant also offered a multi-course dinner at cost.

With only 15 days to organize the 5 event the committee expected to E Vimy & District, and Edmonton draw 150 people. But, thanks to 5 Castledowns. As a result the Lions Of the support of the District 37L Lions $\frac{1}{12}$ Alberta Foundation Flood Fund raised Clubs in Edmonton's surrounding $\frac{1}{12}$ over \$30,000 from the banquet, area, 215 Lions, families and friends $\frac{1}{12}$ silent auctions, 50/50, District 37L attended the charitable event on $\frac{\omega}{2}$ Lions Clubs and Individual financial Tuesday night, July 9^{th} . In attendance $\frac{1}{5}$ donations.
