### Some Edmonton Host Achievements:

- Funding for the Creche Society - Edmonton's first day care for single working mothers (1930s)
- Built Sunset Cottage - first seniors' low rental housing (1930s) followed by Lauderdale Cottages (1940s) and Kensington Court (1950s)
- Started first Lions Dream Home for Klondike Days (1950s)
- Collected over 100,000 pairs of eyeglasses for distribution in India (1950s)
- Involved in building the Club's signature facility known as Central Lions Seniors Centre (1960s) and its expansion in 2007/2008
- Provided funds to purchase Alberta's first dialysis machine (1970s) for the University Hospital in Edmonton.
- Contributed funds for the start of the Lions of Alberta Eye Bank (1980s)
- Donated to start the Dr. Kostiuik Bionic Ear project, a cochlear implant program allowing many to hear for the first time (1990s)
- Further expanded seniors housing starting with Lions Villages Castledowns in 1999, followed by Railtown and Riverside projects.
- In service to Lions Clubs International, two members have become International Directors, five members were Council Chairs, and thirteen were Council members.





### **A Playful Partnership**

The City of Edmonton operates 16 sports and fitness centres including 3 outdoor pools that together enjoy almost 3 million visits each year. Conveniently located in the hearts of neighbourhoods across Edmonton, these popular destinations are vibrant community hubs for recreation, relaxation and wellness.

The City of Edmonton has established indoor playgrounds at four of its Recreation Centres. These welcome facility amenities have proven extremely popular among the many children and young families who frequent our facilities.

Existing locations include:

- Kinsmen Sports Centre
- A.C.T. Aquatic and Recreation Centre
- Mill Woods Recreation Centre
- O'Leary Fitness and Leisure Centre

The playgrounds are equipped with a range of toys including small climbers, slides, push bikes and pedal cars. They provide a safe environment for young children under the age of six to play while being supervised by their parents/guardian. Indoor playgrounds are available on a drop in basis during the playground's hours of operation which vary from facility to facility.

While the City of Edmonton has endeavored to replace and update the equipment at its indoor playgrounds, keeping pace has proven a challenge due to their high use. In addition to maintaining these existing indoor playgrounds, the City of Edmonton is eager to establish similar amenities at our other Recreation Centres and a partnership with the Lions Club would make this possible.

A brand new facility in southwest Edmonton will be completed in 2010 including an aquatic centre with a lane pool as well as a leisure pool, a four sheet arena complex; a fitness centre with jogging/walking track; exercise studios; a children's wing with indoor playground, and three gymnasiums.


