Lions of District 37L... Ishara and other children in Sri Lanka need your help!



Her name is Ishara Lakami and she's 12 years old. She lives in Badowita, Mt. Lavinia, Sri Lanka. Her parents are deceased and she lives with her guardian. She is one of the fifty-two youths currently being assisted through our District 37L- District 306A1 Foster Child Program.

As the 37L District Twinning Chairperson one of my responsibilities is to promote that program through which Ishara and other children in similar circumstances are receiving financial assistance. That assistance is available because of the generous donations given by the Lions clubs and individual Lions in District L. Your generosity is allowing these children to continue their education in spite of some difficult personal circumstances.

The children who are considered for this program are proposed by individual Lions clubs in 306A1 and each proposed child must meet the selection criteria set by District 306A1 in order to be accepted. The program provides assistance funding for the purchase of school materials, school uniforms where required, medicines, personal hygiene items, vision testing and eyeglasses.

The number of children who can be accepted for the program is based upon the amount of money in the trust fund as it's those funds that support this program. The officer of that fund in District 306A1 and the person responsible for seeing the funds are used as directed is Past Council Chairperson Dayantha Fernando.

Donations provided by the District 37L Lions clubs and individual Lions support the needs of the children....

there are no administrative costs taken from those donations. If you support the program you are not just supporting one child you are helping to support many children. I have asked PCC Fernando for more photos of the children currently receiving assistance and once received I'll provide them to our district newsletter editor for placement in the LINK.

Review explores solutions for pooling casino dollars, decreasing wait times for charities

Edmonton... An MLA committee will examine aspects of the province's charitable gaming model and make recommendations on how to improve wait times and the pooling of proceeds from licensed casino events to eligible charitable groups. The committee will also review the number of volunteers a group needs to provide to conduct and manage charitable casino events.

This three-member panel was appointed by Fred Lindsay, Solicitor General and Minister of Public Security, responsible for the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission (AGLC). The committee comes in response to concerns raised by some charities that proceeds and wait times between events vary throughout the province. Charities also expressed difficulty in recruiting and retaining enough volunteers to support their activities including casino events.

"Alberta has a unique charitable gaming model that allows eligible organizations to benefit from casino events," said Lindsay. "These charities earn revenue from casinos

to support their many worthwhile causes and we want to help ensure the charitable casino model and gaming proceeds continue to serve the best interests of these groups."

In 2008-09, almost 3,500 licensed charities earned \$252 million in proceeds from casino events.

The MLA Committee consists of: Chairperson Rob Anderson, MLA - Airdrie-Chestermere and Parliamentary Assistant to the Solicitor General and Minister of Public Security; Dave Rodney, MLA for Calgary-Lougheed; and Doug Elniski, MLA for Edmonton-Calder.

"We look forward to meeting with the various licensed organizations and hearing their insights and ideas," said Anderson.. "From there, we'll review the options and make recommendations."

Meetings will be held with charities throughout the province between October 5 - 15 and written submissions will be accepted until October 30. A final report with recommendations will be completed by March 31, 2010.
