## ADVANCED LIONS LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE

Oak Brook, Illinois

March 8-10, 2014

**The purpose of the Advanced Lions Leadership Institute is to provide Lions leaders with an opportunity to enhance skills in preparation for leadership responsibilities at the zone, region and district levels.**

### **PARTICIPANT QUALIFICATIONS**

1. Candidates for this institute must be from the Constitutional Area II: Canada.
2. Candidates must be Lions that have completed a successful term as club president, but have not yet attained the position of first vice district governor. Lions members who are currently serving as club presidents will be considered on a space-available basis.
3. Candidates must be willing to commit to attending all days of the institute, including group mealtimes, and understand personal time is extremely limited. **Attendance at all classroom sessions and scheduled meals is mandatory.**
4. Graduates of this institute are expected to pursue higher levels of leadership responsibilities at the zone, region and district levels.

### **COST OF THE INSTITUTE**

Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging according to the schedule of the institute. Please note that according to board policy, a non-refundable participation fee of **US\$95.00** will be required to offset these costs for all institutes. This fee will be due no less than four weeks prior to the institute start date. **Please do not send funds until you receive a letter of acceptance to the institute.** Participants are also responsible to pay for their own transportation and related travel expenses to and from the institute site.

### **SELECTION PROCESS**

Because of the high number of applications received by the association, acceptance into the institute is not guaranteed. In order to have as many districts represented as possible, one candidate per district will be selected. More than one participant per district will be allowed on a space available basis. **After the application submission deadline date, all candidates will be notified of selection status.**

The Leadership Division of Lions Clubs International reserves the right to cancel any institute or language-specific classroom due to insufficient applications submitted by the stated application submission deadline date.

The division maintains the quality of all aspects of the institute, including program, faculty and the selection process of participants. The division works in concert with the International

President and the Leadership Committee of the International Board of Directors.

### **APPLICATION PROCEDURE**

All candidates must complete the following items and submit them as indicated below. All completed documents must be submitted by the stated application submission deadline date in order to be considered. Asterisked (\*) forms are attached.

- A. \*Application Form
- B. \*Candidate's Lions History
- C. \*Nomination Form
  1. Must be signed by the \*\*District Governor and Global Leadership Team District Coordinator of the applicant's district.
  2. Should be reviewed and supported by the First Vice District Governor and Second Vice District Governor prior to submitting to LCI.

\*\*Applicants from a provisional zone or provision region must have the signature of the Zone Chairperson or Region Chairperson and Global Leadership Team Area Leader, respectively, in lieu of the District Governor.

### **Expectations of ALLI graduates:**

1. Take on additional leadership roles and responsibilities in their respective zones, regions, and districts.
2. Help to develop Lions leaders in their respective clubs, zones, and districts.
3. Serve as a leadership resource in their respective zones, regions, and districts.
4. Share their institute experiences with members of their zone and district and encourage other qualified Lions to apply to the institutes.

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# MD 37 HALL OF FAME NOMINATION AND DISTRICT 37L AWARDS

The 37L Awards Chairman is requesting nominations for the following awards. The deadline for nominations is October 1, 2013.

## DISTRICT 37L YOUTH ACTIVITIES AWARD

The District Governor will make the decision on the club which is to be presented with the award based on the following criteria. To be eligible for this award, the Club must have completed at least six of the following in the Lionistic Year:

1. Participated in Lions Youth Exchange through their club members personally hosting a youth exchange student.
2. Provided a financial contribution to the District 37L Youth Exchange Program or to the MD 37 Youth Exchange Program.
3. Sponsored youth(s) to travel on the Lions Youth Exchange or to attend a Lions Youth Camp.
4. Participated in or financially supported Lions Quest.
5. Participated in or financially supported at least two local youth organizations such as Scouts, Girl Guides, minor hockey, minor ball or other organized and recognized non-profit youth groups.
6. Provided financial support to the District 37L and Sri Lanka Foster Child Program.
7. Made a financial contribution to Camp He Ho Ha.
8. Sponsored a new Leo Club in their community.
9. Provided funds to purchase equipment for children with special medical needs or for children who are blind or deaf.
10. Participated in the Lions Clubs International Peace Poster Contest.
11. Participated in and/or financially supported Project Pride

A letter of nomination must be received by the District Awards Chairperson no later than October 1, 2013.

## MD 37 HALL OF FAME NOMINATION CRITERIA

Any Lion, Lioness, Lions Club, Lioness Club, or Zone may nominate a candidate from District 37L to the MD37 Hall of Fame.

1. There is no nomination fee.
2. There may be a maximum of one (1) candidate per district, inducted into the Hall of Fame each year.
3. The District Governor must receive nominations at least 30 days prior to the District's Annual Convention. Each individual District will hold an election to determine the successful candidate.
4. The award may be presented to either a Lion or Lioness and only one recipient per District may be elected annually.
5. The award may be presented posthumously.
6. Each candidate must have 15 years of service and be two years removed from Council (if they have served as a member of the Council of Governors).
7. Each candidate should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavours. He/she should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in his/her community.
8. All sponsors will use the standard form, No other will be accepted.
9. The sponsors will ensure the candidate, or representative, will be in attendance at the Multiple District Convention.
10. All successful candidates will be inducted to the Hall of Fame at the next MD 37 convention.
11. A brief biography of each inductee shall be announced to the delegates attending the annual MD 37 convention, and published in the subsequent MD 37 newsletter.
12. A perpetual plaque for this award will be kept in a prominent place in the MD 37

office.

13. The application for this award may be found on the MD 37 website.

14. The application must be received by the DISTRICT AWARDS CHAIRPERSON no later than October 1, 2013.

## DR. LYNN G. HALL LEADERSHIP AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING LEADERSHIP IN LIONISM

This Award was established in 1997 in recognition of the outstanding Leadership qualities in Lionism displayed by the late Lion Dr. Lynn G. Hall. Lion Lynn was a member of various clubs for over 50 years, serving two terms as District Governor: 1952-53 and 1976-76. Always quick to step forward, no matter what the project, Lion Lynn was a leader by example. He exemplified what Lionism is all about. His professional life included teaching and school administration as well as serving as the Mayor of Lac La Biche and Councilor of Wainwright.

## AWARDS CRITERIA

1. A Lion Member in good standing with a Lions Club for a MINIMUM OF TEN YEARS.
2. A Lion who has demonstrated continuous leadership for a MINIMUM OF THREE YEARS.
3. A Lion whose leadership may be at the community, club, district or International level or a combination thereof.

## APPLICATION CRITERIA

1. Application may be made by any Lion in good standing within District 37L
2. The nomination to be in the form of a letter which includes the following:
  - Name of Award applied for
  - Name of the nominated Lion
  - Name of that Lion's Club
  - When the Lion became a member
  - Their commitment to Lions

## THE HERB MOELLER UNSUNG HERO AWARD

This award was established in memory of Lion Herb Moeller, a member of the Edmonton Northgate Lions Club, following his death in September 1999. Lion Herb was the club treasurer and worked tirelessly on behalf of the youth in our community. Lion Herb was quick to volunteer and serve on club projects and activities. He had joined Lions in 1986.

## AWARDS CRITERIA

A Lion in good standing who has worked tirelessly behind the scenes to advance the causes of Lionism and his/her club.

A Lion who has volunteered regularly to serve on club committees, projects and fundraisers.

A Lion who may have worked on zone or district projects.

A Lion who has not received, within the previous three years, a District Award, an International President's Certificate, or a District Governor Appreciation Award.

## APPLICATION CRITERIA

1. Application may be made by any Lions Club in good standing within 37L.
2. A letter written by the most recent Past Club President to include the following:
  - Name of Award applied for
  - Name of the nominee
  - Name the nominee's club
  - Biography of nominee and his/her commitment to Lions based on the above criteria.

The awards chair must receive nominations by October 1, 2013.

## Lions Clubs Fund Important Ultrasound Equipment at the Regional Eye Centre

Lions have scored another great success for the Regional Eye Centre at the Royal Alexandra Hospital.

The Lions Eye Research Fund (LERF) announced on November 1, 2012 that they were committed to raising \$120,000 to purchase a suite of new ultrasound equipment for the Regional Eye Centre. The equipment will be used in the early detection and treatment of eye lesions and tumours, and includes an **Ultrasound Biomicroscope** (which allows for the creation of a highly detailed ultrasound images of the eye), **B-Scan Ocular Ultrasound Equipment** (used to create a two-dimensional cross-section view of the eye), and a **dental chair** (to provide greater comfort to patients as they undergo ultrasound testing).

Just nine months after announcing the start of the project, the LERF Committee is proud to announce the ultrasound campaign a success thanks to more than 70 gifts from over 50 Lions Clubs across Alberta. An amazing accomplishment! Other key funders included the **Lions of Alberta Foundation**, who donated \$25,000, and **Lions Clubs International Foundation**, who have

announced a generous \$60,000 grant to match the funds already raised and put us over our \$120,000 goal. An additional \$6,500 in donations were secured from the community by the **Royal Alexandra Hospital Foundation** to help the Lions Clubs make the new ultrasound equipment a reality.

Dr. Ian McDonald, Clinical Chief of Ophthalmology for Alberta Health Services, was thrilled to learn of the goal being met. "All of us at the Regional Eye Centre are overwhelmed at the generous support we have received from Lions Clubs," said Dr. MacDonald. "The new ultrasound equipment will significantly improve patient eye care in northern Alberta. By detecting tumours sooner, special forms of radiotherapy can treat the eye as opposed to surgically removing it."

The LERF will be announcing their next project at an event on November 6, 2013 – watch for more information on this exciting new endeavour. In the meantime, gifts from Lions Clubs will be directed to our ever growing **Lions Eye Research Fund Endowment**.

The Royal Alexandra Hospital Foundation would like to extend their sincere thanks to all the LERF Committee members and Lions who worked so passionately to make this equipment purchase a reality.

"We know that community support builds great hospitals," said Royal Alexandra Hospital Foundation President and CEO Andrew Otway. "The outstanding support of Lions Clubs is one of the best examples of how widespread community support plays such a vital role. Thank you, Lions!"
